What Are Wider Achievements?

In Cawdor you'll hear us use the words 'wider achievement'. This means everything that children learn from hobbies, leadership groups, interests, volunteering, part-time jobs and so on. The skills they gain from these are important for young people for life, and also for their future college, university and job applications. These skills are valued by employers and are an important part of your child's learning and development. How Do We Record And Celebrate Wider Achievement?

In your child's profile they have a section for their 'Wider Achievements'. These include achievements both within and out of school. Throughout the year your child will add to their wider achievements, and we will ask you to share what you are proud of. Each term we have a Google Form where you can share achievements from the term with us to add to your child's Profile.

We are developing children's understanding of the [metaskills](#) to support them to identify the skills that they are developing through these achievements. Wider achievements are celebrated in classrooms.

What Opportunities Do We Have For Wider Achievement In School?

Pupil Leadership Groups

All children in P1-P7 are in one of our pupil leadership groups that work to improve our school. In the 2025/2026 session our groups are:

Each group has an action plan and many are working towards accredited awards.

Masterclasses

Throughout the year children have the opportunity to take part in Masterclasses which are skills-based learning opportunities. These are led by adults (teachers & PSAs) and focus on developing the [metaskills](#).

We have had a range of masterclasses which have included chat club, chess, choreography, coding, dance fitness, drawing, drama, karaoke, origami, running, singing, sudoku, tapestry, yoga to name more than a few.

Children reflect on the skills that they develop through masterclasses in their profile.

Lunchtime/ Afterschool Clubs
